



Course overview

Research has shown that the first eight years of a child's life are critical for their cognitive, social, emotional and physical development. Therefore, it is vital they receive the support they need for this development.

This course will equip learners with a detailed understanding of child development, including safeguarding children and promoting their health, safety and welfare. Learners will also look at how to promote equality, diversity and inclusion in Early Years settings, support children with additional needs, and support children's development. They will look at how to plan and lead play activities to support children's learning and development and how to work in partnership with other professionals and key individuals.

Who is suitable?

This qualification is suitable for learners who work, or wish to work, with children from birth to 5 years old in a variety of settings. The qualification prepares learners for employment as Early Years Educators, enabling them to work with children from birth to 5 years and gain knowledge of children aged 5 to 7 years. It develops the knowledge and skills required to work with children from birth to 5 years together with an understanding of the expected development of children aged 5 to 7 years. The qualification also provides opportunities for the confirmation of competence for learners working towards Early Years Educator status.

Learners will practice the importance of observation when working with children, promoting a healthy lifestyle and developing literacy and mathematical skills. This practice will be underpinned by knowledge in planning and reviewing, legislation and regulations and supporting children and their parents/carers. Apprentices will increase in confidence and professionalism and become a valuable member of any educational team.

Course Requirements

- Learners must be 16 years of age and above.
- Learners should have a minimum of level two in literacy and numeracy or equivalent.
- Learners must be working in an appropriate Early Years environment for a minimum of 350 and a maximum of 400 hours, across the duration of the course. This includes placements.
- Learners must have a designated mentor within their workplace or placement, who will be responsible for observing practice regularly.
